

### CALL FOR STATEMENTS OF INTEREST

The Department of Law of the Università degli Studi Roma Tre, aiming to strengthen its profile in the European and international context, is seeking to fill a tenured position at the level of full professor (professore ordinario) in the field of private law (Diritto Privato, Droit Civil, Jus Civile), with particular regard to studies related to non-patrimonial aspects of private law, feminist theories of law, law & gender.

In particular, the Department wishes to involve the applicant in the following areas:

- Classes entirely taught in languages different from Italian of significant importance in the practice of future lawyers
- Legal clinics
- Preparation and coaching of the Roma Tre teams that participate in international moot-court competitions
- European and international research projects
- Dual degree programmes with foreign academic institutions.

Applications are invited from researchers in any field of legal scholarship. Researchers interested should already hold a post as full professor (or equivalent) in academic institutions or possess the public titles that enable them to access such a tenured position (such as the Italian ‘Abilitazione scientifica nazionale’).

They should also have an established track record of publications of international dissemination and be able to prove participation in important research projects, excellent evaluations in courses held, and experience in teaching in institutions (foreign institutions included), different from the one to which they belong.

All the aspects concerning salaries, teaching loads, and legal status are regulated by the relevant Italian laws and by the by-laws of the Università Roma Tre and of the Department of Law.

Those interested who belong to foreign academic institutions are invited to verify, in advance, all pension and social security issues.

The person selected is expected to teach in the law degree programme (Laurea magistrale in giurisprudenza – LMG/01) which is a 5-year programme. In that respect knowledge of Italian is required.

Statements of interest must be presented no later than **December 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021** at the following address ([didattica.giurisprudenza@uniroma3.it](mailto:didattica.giurisprudenza@uniroma3.it)).

On the basis of the statements of interest received the Department will decide whether to proceed, indicating the field of the law in which the formal call for candidacies will be opened and to which any researcher – even if he/she has not previously expressed interest - possessing the appropriate qualifications may apply.
